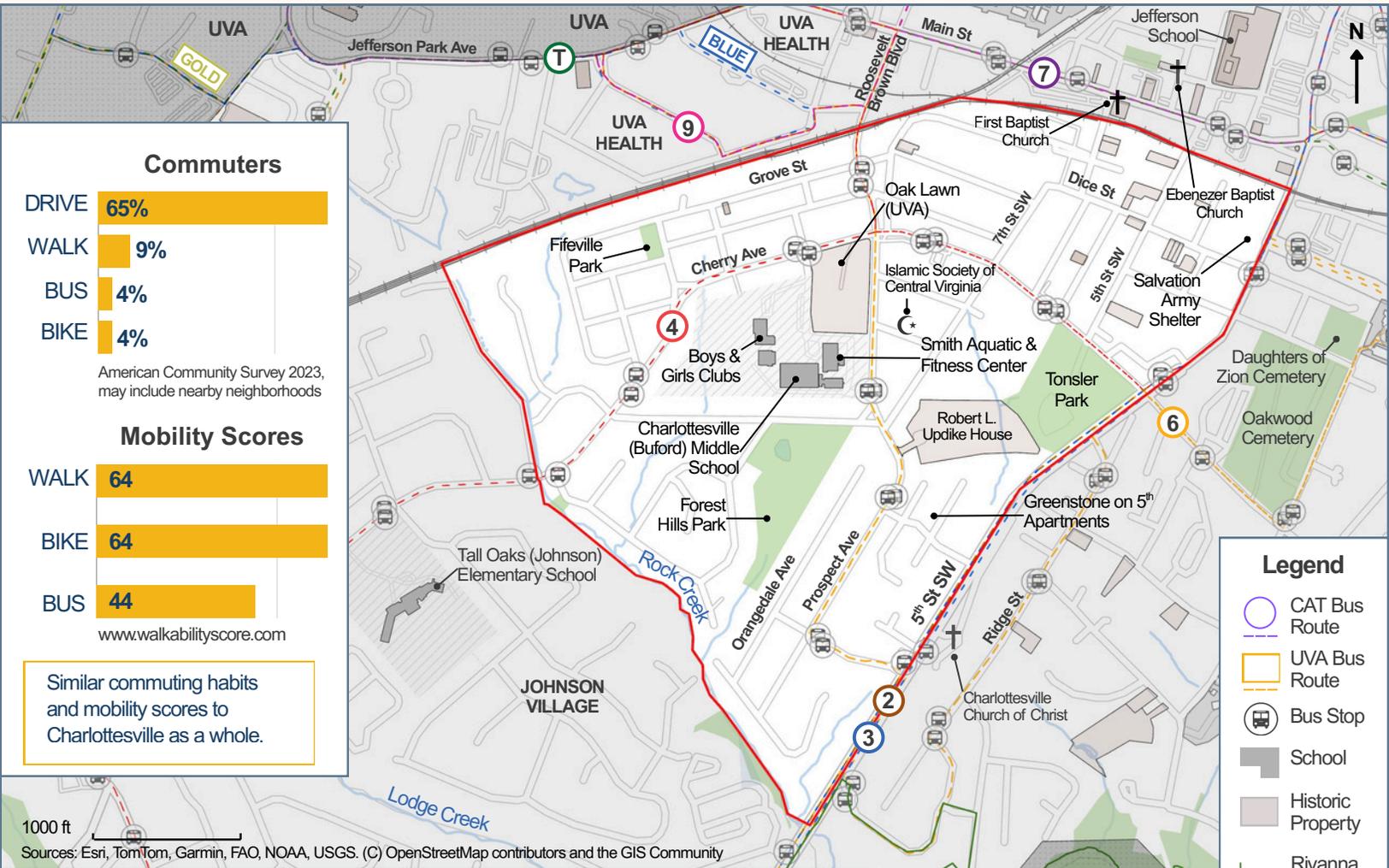

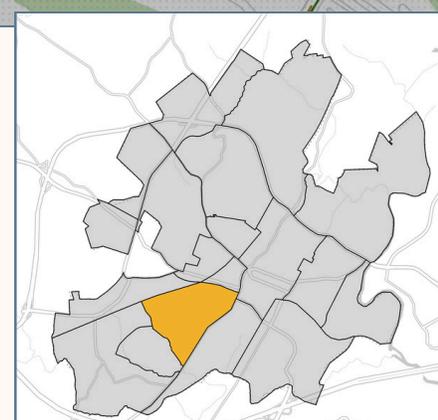

Fifeville gets its name from the family who owned the plantation that would later be subdivided in the 1890s for homes built by Black families, many of whom worked on the nearby railroad. Fifeville was annexed by Charlottesville in 1916. In the 1970s, the apartments now known as Greenstone on 5th as well as homes in the Orangedale neighborhood were built. One of the first neighborhoods to be affected by gentrification, Fifeville is home to an active neighborhood association that helped craft the Cherry Avenue Small Area plan and leads city-wide anti-displacement efforts. In recent years, UVA has acquired land south of the railroad tracks, including the Oak Lawn property that was the Fife family home.

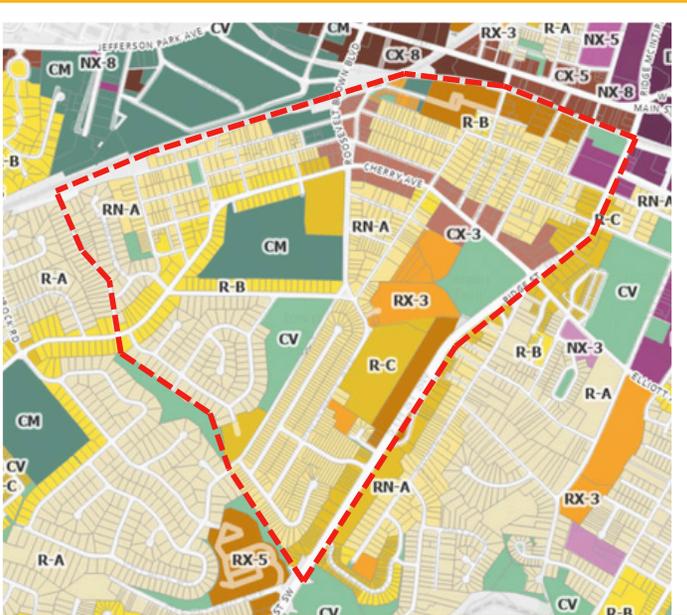

## ZONING

What kinds of buildings can be built, and where?



ZONING ORDINANCE (adopted 2024)

In early 2024, City Council designated Fifeville a “Core Neighborhood” and zoned most of its residential areas **RN-A**. This allows a base of no more than one existing home per lot, plus one additional newly built unit.

Cherry Ave west of 9th St, part of Forest Hills Ave, and parts of 5<sup>th</sup> St were zoned **R-B** or **R-C**, residential but allowing more units per lot.

**RX-3** and **RX-5** areas allow residential and limited commercial uses, at base heights of 3 and 5 stories.

Buildings along Main Street and Cherry Ave zoned **CX-3**, **CX-5** or **CX-8** allow a mix of commercial and residential uses, at base heights of 3, 5, and 8 stories.

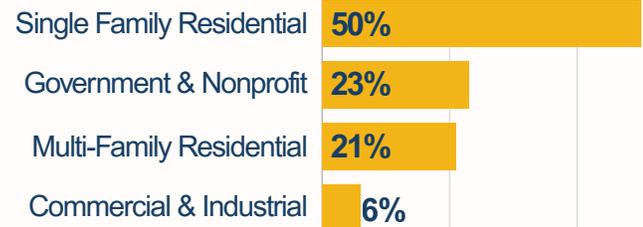
