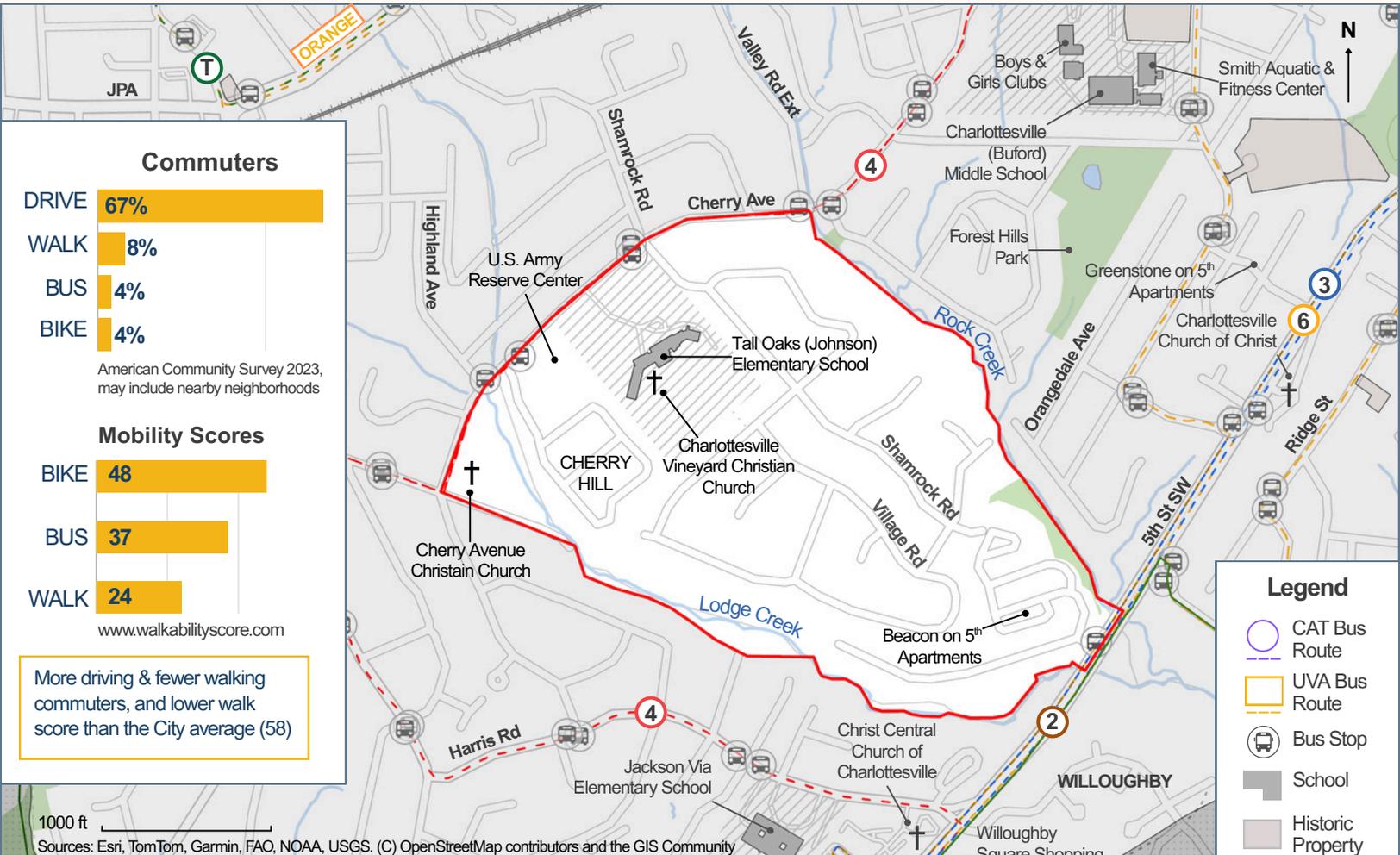

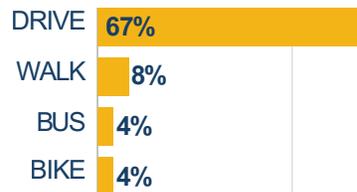

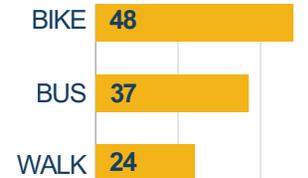


Commuters

Mobility Scores

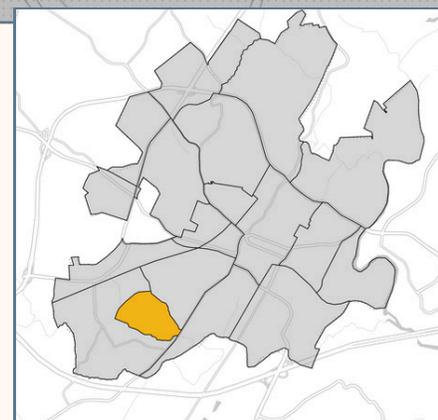

Johnson Village was part of Charlottesville's final annexation of Albemarle County land in 1963 that also included the Greenbrier neighborhood, the Barracks Road shopping area, and more. The single-family homes in the original Johnson Village development were built in the mid 1960s and 1970s. The same developer also owned the land that would become the Forest Hills neighborhood, the U.S. Army Reserve Center, and Johnson Elementary, whose 1954 opening pre-dates Johnson Village. Rock Creek and Lodge Creek each flow into Moore's Creek and form the northern and southern boundaries. Shamrock Rd is the only point of access into the neighborhood by car (3 were originally planned), but there is a pedestrian path connecting to the 242-unit Beacon on 5th Apartments built in 2017.

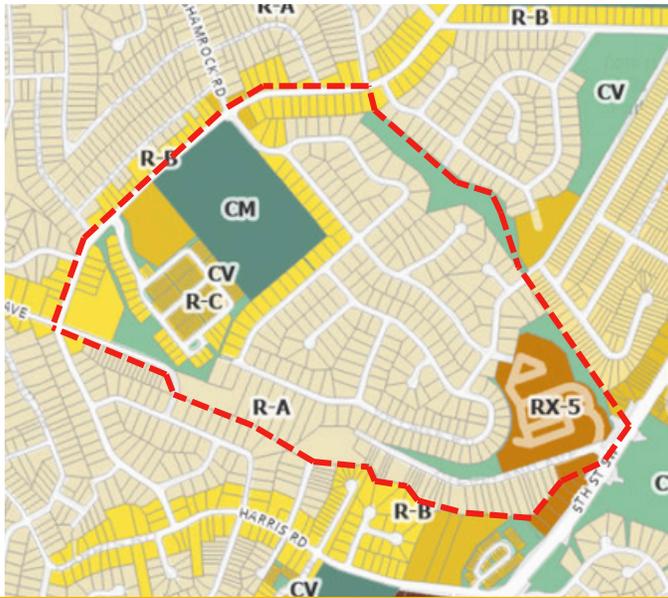
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ZONING

What kinds of buildings can be built, and where?



ZONING ORDINANCE (adopted 2024)

In early 2024, City Council adopted a new zoning ordinance, the first major overhaul since 2003.

Most of Johnson Village is zoned **R-A**, allowing residential uses at a base level maximum of 3 units per lot, 4 if the existing house is preserved, and 6 if affordable housing requirements are met.

Lots along Cherry Ave and Tall Oaks Elementary as well as the Cherry Hill subdivision are zoned **R-B** or **R-C** with base levels of 6 or 8 units per lot. Preservation and affordability bonuses allow 8 & 12 (R-B) or 10 & 12 units (R-C) per lot.

Beacon on 5th and the nearby Cleveland Ave townhomes are zoned **RX-5** allowing residential and limited commercial uses with a base level maximum of 5 stories.
